

THE NAVISION TO BUSINESS CENTRAL JOURNEY

1984

A company in Denmark called Personal Computing & Consulting (PC&C) is where Navision was originated.



1985

PC&C released its first accounting package PCPlus - a single user application with basic accounting functionality.

1987

Release of the 1st version of Navision which allowed multiple users to access the software simultaneously. Selling primarily in Denmark until 1990. Navision 3 was then distributed in other European countries, including Germany and UK.



1995

Due to this success the company renamed to Navision Software. The first version of Navision based on Microsoft Windows 95 was released.



2000

Navision Software merged with fellow Danish firm Damgaard to form NavisionDamgaard.

2002

Microsoft bought Navision to go with its previous acquisition of Great Plains. Navision became a new division of Microsoft, named Microsoft Business Solutions and also Microsoft CRM.

2001

Company changed name to 'Navision A/s'

2003

Microsoft announced plans to develop an entirely new ERP system (Project Green), later decided to continue development of all ERP systems (Dynamics AX, Dynamics NAV, Dynamics GP and Dynamics SL). Launching all four ERP systems with the same new role-based user interface, SQL based reporting and analysis, Share-Point based portal, Pocket PC-based mobile clients and integration with Microsoft office.



2008

Releasing Dynamics NAV 2009, containing original 'classic' client, as well as a new three tier GUI called the RoleTailored Client (RTC).



2005

Microsoft re-branded the product and re-released as Microsoft Dynamics NAV.

2013

Microsoft released Dynamics NAV 2013 delivering improved performance and new technology components with additional strong functionality.



2014

Microsoft released Dynamics NAV 2015. Improvements such as Tablet Client, Office 365 integration, document reporting using Word, Bank Integration.

2015

October saw the launch of NAV 2016 with enhancements including reporting, email integration, deferral accounting and an improved CRM.



2017

NAV 2018 was released and the announcement that the rebrand of Dynamics 365 was imminent.

2016

With the launch of NAV 2017 came outlook integration, an enhanced improved interface and the posting preview function

2018

The rebranding of Microsoft Dynamics NAV to Microsoft Dynamics 365 Business Central brought together both products into one solution. All you now need to do is think about how you would like this solution deployed! Cloud, on premise or hybrid - the choice is yours!!
